CCA BOARD MESSAGE

STRANGER AT THE DOOR – WHAT DO I DO??

This safety scenario is provided by Captain Susan Smith, PG District VI. This demonstration concerning a very a public safety concern was done last week. It is in your best interest to not even open the door or to talk to the person through the door. Just don't answer the door. Please read this story that Captain Smith has provided and take precautions when someone comes to your door.

Yesterday, WJLA Channel 7 News teamed up with our Regional Investigations Division, and our Media Relations Division to do an experiment in a PGPD community to expose citizens' vulnerabilities to cunning criminals. This experiment was originally supposed to occur in Clinton, an area that had experienced a small string of these types of home invasions burglaries. But due to yesterday's plane crash, they moved it the experiment to Beltsville. [They wanted to move it as far away from the crash, since traffic was awful.]

Here's what they did:

An actor knocked on random residences to find someone home. He was driving a non-descript truck, and wore a safety vest, hard hat, and ID card that was purposefully turned toward his chest so it couldn't be read. The actor told the homeowner that he was with the 'Water Department' and needed to check something inside their home. In 70% of cases, the homeowners admitted this person entrance without asking any questions or verifying any identification. One person told the actor he could go into her home unattended so the homeowner could do some gardening outside. The actor and news team never entered homes. As soon as permission was granted, they pointed out what was really happening. WJLA is planning to air the experiment in late April.

Please remind everyone to be curious and bold enough to ask questions, and to say 'no' with conviction, as appropriate. It is extremely rare that a utility company would have to enter your home. You can always make the person wait outside while you call the company to verify. And don't use the company number provided by the person at the door!

In Clinton, they had a few cases where two men approached a house, dressed as workmen. The victims let the men inside, and while one person distracted the victim, the other ran upstairs to steal jewelry and any other valuables that could be quickly grabbed. The County also had a



couple of banks robbed by a suspect wearing a hard hat and safety vest!

I wanted you all to be aware, and share this information with your friends, family, and neighbors. Thank you, and stay safe!

There have been safety tips from PG Police in the newsletter. Here are some tips from Montgomery County Police District 3.

The Third District is seeing an increase in theft from autos. Often these thefts occur from unlocked vehicles.

Please remember to keep your vehicles locked at all times. Please also remember to not leave any valuables in your vehicle. Often these thefts go unreported, please report all thefts from vehicles via the police non-emergency number at 301-279-8000, this will assist us in apprehending the perpetrators. Do not try to stop the thief or thieves if you see them in action. Call 911 immediately.

Again, always remember the tips below.

1. Do not leave your vehicle warming up while you are in the house.
2. Do not leave your car unlocked, even if you are going back into the house for a few minutes. Make sure you keep clicking your car fab until the horn honks. Then you will know that your car is locked.


3. Remember, thieves look for easy ways to get into a house. An easy way to get into your house is through an open window or door. Do not leave windows and doors open during the night even if it a beautiful warm night. You are giving someone that easy opportunity to get into your house.

CAR THEFTS ARE RAMPANT

When fueling your vehicles, keep your keys in your hand, secure valuables on your person or lock your car doors. Below is an excerpt from an incident that occurred off Cherry Hill Road:

The victim stated that she was at the gas pump and began to walk away from her 1998 Silver Honda CRV, when someone told her that the suspect (Unknown) stole items out of her car. The victim ran back to her vehicle to see if anything was taken when she realized that her wallet, which contained 120 dollars cash, 3 credit cards, and her driver's license was gone off the front passenger seat. The suspect opened the passenger side front door, which was unlocked, grabbed something and then fled into the apartment complex.

Around the County, there have been cases where a second car will pull alongside the person who is fueling up. A passenger in the suspect car hunches down out of sight, and opens passenger side car door undetected. They're good at stealing purses and wallets this way.

BULK PICKUP FOR BOTH COUNTIES


Prince George's County:

The county will make a Special Bulk pick up for old appliances, scrap metal, old mattresses or furniture: Call 311 to schedule the pickup of your items.

Montgomery County:

Since Montgomery County Calverton residents do not have county trash pickup, Montgomery County Special Bulk pickup is only for scrap metal, old lawnmower, appliance, etc. Call 311 the week before to schedule a special pickup on your recycling day the next week.

If you have old mattresses or old furniture you have to call your trash hauler. Some people have Beltsville Refuse picking up their trash, so you need to call Beltsville Refuse about picking up your old mattress, couch, etc.
