

# HIGHLIGHTS OF FEBRUARY 2014 CCA BOARD MEETING

Holiday Light Contest. The winners were awarded their prizes.

Corporal Haynes. The Prince George's County Police will be cracking down on anyone who leaves a car idling and unattended. Cars that are running and are unattended are subject to being stolen or property being stolen from the car.

Treasurer's Report. Treasurer Tom H presented the treasurer's report. A little bit more membership dues are coming in, but most of it is done. Money from the ads collected for the 2014 Calverton Directory has been received.

Publications Committee. The Calverton Directory is almost ready to go to the printer. There were no inquiries in the past month about the vacancy of the newsletter editor. It was suggested to put a job description in the March newsletter.

Zoning and Legal Committee. Ben M drafted a letter for review to see if it can be used to inform Calverton residents of zoning and codes violations. The committee also stressed again that we need to do something regarding the oversized structures in Calverton. There has been no response from Prince Georges County. The committee was also concerned about a special exception sign for an accessory apartment. Frank K will contact neighbors.

Social Committee. Margaret and Claire will take care of refreshments for the April general membership meeting. They will also help with the July 4<sup>th</sup> 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration.

Calverton Recreation Council. Basketball is going on now and will end March 2. There will be no spring baseball season because there are no volunteers to support it. Fall soccer is a go at this time. The Poms are active at this time.

Corner of Calverton and Gracefield. The CCA sponsored a cleanup from the corner of Gracefield Road and Calverton Boulevard to part of the way along Gracefield Road toward Riderwood Village.

Several questions were raised: Who owns this property? Who should be maintaining the corner with the Calverton sign? Who is responsible for removing snow from the sidewalk? Contact Cherri Branson, the District 5 Montgomery County Council member.

Shed Update. Jerry went to the Calverton Pool Board Meeting to discuss the shed that the CCA is going to install there.

#### **NEWSLETTER EDITOR WANTED**

# BEING A GOOD NEIGHBOR CORNER

Here are some more informational facts regarding zoning code violations and parking restriction violations in Calverton.

Being a good neighbor means keeping your grass cut. Don't be surprised if your grass grows to 12 inches long that the county will come "visit" you. Your grass cannot get that long. If it does get that long and you refuse to cut it, the county will come and cut it for you. However, they will send you a bill for their grass cutting services.

Being a good neighbor means parking all the vehicles at your home legally so that they are not violating any restrictions that may lead to a police ticket. The CCA President has received several phone calls lately about the way people are parking their vehicles. She is now telling people to call the non-emergency police number because this is happening so many times. We should all know better because these are violations of the Maryland state driving and parking laws. Here are a few parking laws, and most were previously mentioned in another issue of the Calverton *Current*:

- Vehicles cannot be parked opposite the flow of traffic. Left wheels of your vehicle must not be against the curb. Park on the side of the street in the direction that you would be driving.
- This is a new one. Parking on the street is to be parallel to the curb, not perpendicular. The right side of your vehicle should be on the curb or parallel to the curb. The front end of your vehicle should not be facing the curb. Your vehicle should not be parked perpendicular to the curb. This is not a shopping center so you do not pull your car straight into the curb.
- Vehicles must be parked at least 35 feet from an intersection or an intersecting roadway.
- No parking within 5 feet of a driveway.
- Do not park directly across from your neighbor's driveway so that they cannot pull out of their own driveway without running into your vehicle.
- Parking your vehicle across the sidewalk so that it blocks the path of pedestrians is illegal. Do not block the sidewalk.

Think about where you are parking your vehicle so that you won't get a ticket. Let us all take a look at how our vehicles are parked at our houses or near our neighbors' houses. Let us all Be a Good Neighbor.

Maybe you could partner with a neighbor to be co-Block Captains and split the duties--one person deliver the newsletter, the other collect dues, or you could alternate months of delivering the newsletter.

Please volunteer to serve your community as a Block The residents on these blocks are not receiving this newsletter, paying their CCA dues, or receiving the Calverton Directory every two years.

#### ATTENTION, CALVERTON

If you have a question regarding seeing an abandoned car, grass too tall, abandoned house, fence or shed being built without a building permit, oversized vehicles parked on the driveway or street, you need to call the county.

If you live in Prince George's County, call 311. If you live in Montgomery County and have a 572 number, call 240-777-0311; otherwise, call 311. You can also go online with the county you live in and file the complaint online.
