President's Message

We had three really good speakers from the Prince George's States Attorney Office at our April General Membership meeting. Terry Bell came from the Community Prosecution Team. Donine Carrington, Assistant Chief for the Family Violence Unit, attended our meeting. The final guest was Frank Cubero from the Economic Crime Unit.

Ms. Bell prosecutes cases that involve crimes that impact communities, such as; theft, burglary, break-ins, etc. She has been instrumental in prosecuting the serial burglar and many burglary rings in Prince George's County. She told us that neighbors and community residents need to call 911 when they see something strange or suspicious. Do not ignore the activity. Call 911.

Ms. Carrington prosecutes cases involving domestic violence, elder abuse, child abuse and human trafficking. She emphasized that Prince George's County is working really hard to end domestic violence. She also told us that the community and neighbors play an important role in ending and stopping domestic violence. We need your help. The Calverton community needs to report any suspicious abuse incident that you think maybe domestic violence against your neighbor (adult or child, man or woman). Please call 911 immediately to get help for your neighbor. PG is opening a Family Crisis Center on June 9 which the county hopes will promote and facilitate the elimination of domestic violence by providing counseling, education and support services to men, women and children. Mr. Cubero spoke on identity theft, credit card theft, phone scams and theft from mailboxes. He reiterated what the police have been telling us – DO NOT LEAVE CHECKS IN YOUR MAILBOX. Mail your checks at the post office. If you cannot get out to mail your check, call a neighbor to help you. If you are a victim of theft from your mailbox, call 911 to report but also call the Postal Inspectors at 877-876-2455 (press 3). When you are at an ATM or paying by credit card at gas station, please check for a device that can read your card or get your pin number. When you receive an email from someone that you don't know, DO NOT OPEN IT – DELETE IT. Sometimes emails come in with a person's name that you

might recognize but the email address is not correct – delete it, do not open it. When it comes to phone scams involving the IRS or your loved one has been kidnapped, just hang up the phone and call 911 to report the call. Hopefully, you have caller ID and can give the police a phone number. Some home owners' insurance offer protection for identity theft. There are also other companies that offer protection.

Mr. Cubero also told us that it's a good idea to check your credit reports from time to time, especially before applying for a major loan or a mortgage. This gives you time to have the Credit Reporting Agency correct any errors. Fortunately, you can get credit reports for free. The Federal Fair Credit Reporting Act allows consumers to receive a free copy of their credit reports once a year from each of the three Credit Reporting Agencies. In addition, Maryland law gives its residents the right to a free annual copy of their credit report. This means you can review your credit report six times a year for free (two free reports from each agency). NEW BUSINESS:

PG Recycle did not pick up for two weeks in Calverton - resi-

dents of Calverton got skipped for the new Monday recycle pick up. Many residents called 311 to report the problem.

District 21st Delegation wrap up meeting will be on Tuesday, June 7, 7 pm at Martin Luther King MS on Ammendale Road in Beltsville. Senator Jim Rosapepe, Delegate Barbara Frush, Delegate Joseline Pena-Melnyk and Delegate Ben Barnes will be there to gives us the legislative wrap up from Annapolis.

PG Family Justice Center is having a grand opening on Thursday, June 9, 2:00 pm in Upper Marlboro. It is a place where victims and families of domestic violence can get help.

Burning leaves in yards is not allowed in either PG or MC. Calverton residents cannot burn leaves or trash in the yard. It is against the law in both PG and MC. If you see someone burning leaves or trash in the yard, please call 911 because this is a dangerous situation that can result in a big fire.

Trees that are dead at Calverton Boulevard and Gracefield have been tagged by MC. These two trees will be cut down and will be replaced in a few years when money is available.

Vehicles parked right on the corner is against the law. Vehicles need to be 35 feet from the corner. Calverton residents are calling 911 to report illegal parking. Police are now giving tickets to vehicles illegally parked in Calverton.

Calverton residents are not allowed to have parties or yard sales every other weekend in order to make money. These events are county violations in both PG and MC. Please call 311 to report this violation or get online and file a complaint with the appropriate county.

Maydale Nature Center is now in the Montgomery County budget. The budget still has to be approved. MC is currently planning to tear down the current structure at Maydale and plans to bring

in a trailer with a deck by the summer of 2017.

Affordable Senior Housing plans are moving along. The complex will be built near the East County Regional Services Center on Briggs Chaney Road. The plan is for a 3 story structure, 122 units, independent living only and 122 parking spaces. The plan will also include the installation of sidewalks on Robey Road.

Neighborhood Walk on April 25 was good. We had a nice turnout of Calverton residents. Both MC and PG Police and Fire walked with us. Thank you to everyone who walked in the Neighborhood Watch Walk.

PG roads south of Calverton Boulevard have not been paved after 50 years. Roads such as; Chapel View, Craiglawn, Fallston and other roads are still waiting. The CCA is sending a letter to PG DPW&T asking the department to do something about the roads in Calverton that have not been paved for many, many years. Roads have been paved in some parts of PG Calverton – roads north of Calverton Boulevard were paved.

Shanandale Park will be given a facelift. MC has come up with a plan where some trees will be taken down and they will replant new trees in the fall. One CCA board member will talk to residents who live around the park about the plan and will also invite them to the June 2 board meeting to discuss the plan.

Shanandale Park summer movie night is being considered by the CCA. Some residents would like to see summer programs at the park.

Beltsville summer concerts held at the Beltsville Community Center are sponsored by the Beltsville Recreation Council. The CCA board voted not to participate and help with the concerts since we will be having our own summer movies at the Shanandale park and also spend a lot of money on our Celebrate Calverton July 4th event.

Next CCA Board meeting is Thursday, June 2, 7pm at Calverton Elementary. This is the last board meeting until September. There are no board meetings in July and August.



Here are more tips to help the police with arrests and to keep the thieves from having any opportunity for a theft:


Let's be proactive in our community and take steps to stop crime:

- Take advantage of the very helpful free home/commercial security survey provided by your COPS officers in both PG and MC.
- Park in a well-lighted area and secure your vehicle. Remove all items of value when away from your vehicle. Don't leave any spare keys on your car.
- Keep your car locked. Continue hitting the lock button on the car key fab until you hear the horn. When you hear the horn you will know that your car is locked.
- Carry your key fob in your hand so that you can push the panic button as you get closer to your car if something happens.
- Carry a whistle with you to blow so that you can attract attention when something happens or when you see something happening.
- If you hear or see something that doesn't seem right, call
 911 immediately, don't wait.
- The police and businesses need your help to stop crime.
 Try to get a description of the person(s), description of the car and the license plate. But, be safe doing it.

When you see something, you need to say something. Call 911!!
