HIGHLIGHTS OF NOVEMBER 2013 CCA BOARD MEETING

Minutes. The minutes were approved from the October Board meeting.

Guest. Officer Justin Haynes, Prince George's Community Police, now has a cell phone so that Board members can reach him directly. He announced the Safe Shopper informational meeting on November 12 at the Laurel Senior Center. Call 911 if you see a strange car or strange person that looks or acts suspicious. District VI is offering a child safety seat check.

Treasurer's Report. Treasurer Tom H. gave the Treasurer's report. The 2014 membership dues are coming in at a faster rate than last year.

Crime Activity and Reporting. Carolyn G noticed a strange car parked outside her house at 3:30 am one morning. She called 911, and the Montgomery County police came and checked the car. The police took two big trash bags from the car.

The Prince George's County Citizen Police Academy will begin in January 2014. Applicants have to pass a background check to participate. Montgomery County has its own program.

Karen M gets crime incident reports for the newsletter from the *Washington Post* and Prince George's County *Gazette*. These reports give only the block number rather than the house number to protect privacy. Send Prince George's Police Officer Justin Haynes an email about a specific case number or crime incident for more information. A third party, not the police, prepares the incident report.

There's No Moon Out Tonight. Margaret P says that the area around the Calverton sign at Calverton Boulevard and Gracefield Road is very dark, and youth tend to linger there. A street light is sorely needed there. She called Montgomery County Police Officer Patel to determine which county office she should contact.

Correspondence. Letters and donations need to go to Calverton and Galway Elementary Schools for their programs. The letter needs to go out to Montgomery County for demolition of the Calverton wall on Shanandale Road.

Many Happy Returns of the Day. Fifteen Calverton residents went to Albert Turner's penthouse office to wish him happy 97th birthday and to present him with a large greeting card. Mr. Turner developed Calverton and founded Carrollton Enterprises. Margaret P put together photos of the event. William Steen, Mr. Turner's assistant, had cake and coffee ready for the group.

Storage Shed. The CCA vacated the storage space at Calverton Elementary School and moved 2 file cabinets and 8 boxes to temporary storage at the Calverton Pool. It was proposed to install a shed for \$3,447 to house these items plus a grill on pool property. The CCA Board approved this proposal. The pool will cover the cost of insurance.

Beautification Program. The Beautification Committee, composed of six Calverton residents, identified six winners: one First Prize and five Honorable Mentions. The monetary prizes will be awarded at the General Membership Meeting November 13.

This question came up during the committee's review: how to verify membership in the CCA and thus eligibility in the Beautification Contest? If the Block Captain of one of the applicants does not collect dues for that block, how do we verify membership? We need to do a better job in getting Block Captains to collect dues and turn them in so that CCA membership can be verified.

CCA Bylaws. There are still a few changes that need to be made. They will be handed out at the November 2013 General Membership Meeting and voted upon at the April 2014 General Membership Meeting.

Calverton Sign. The landscaping was completed at the sign on Calverton Boulevard and Gracefield Road. Mr. Albert Turner of Carrollton Enterprises donated money for landscaping. Jerry R wrote a thank-you note to him.

Upcoming Meetings.

- December 5 Montgomery County Council is holding a meeting at 9:30 a.m. to discuss rat complaints. Not sure if the meeting is related to the Calverton rat problem. The CCA had made a complaint to Council member Valerie Ervin's office about rats on Gracefield Road after the WSSC started digging there.
- December 16 Legislative East Montgomery County breakfast. Mark D is organizing the meeting and will get CCA members to attend.
- Upcoming Eastern Montgomery Regional Services
 Center Director Jewru Bandel will begin IDA Police
 Sector meetings in 2014. However, the three-week
 meeting notice that his office sends out is not enough
 advanced time to be included in the newsletter but can
 be put on the Calverton website and other outlets to
 let people know.

Calverton Recreation Council (CRC). The CRC is having trouble staffing its programs because the number of adult volunteers has dropped. Spring 2014 sports may have to fold because there are no volunteers for commissioners and coaches. Need to find other ways to get volunteers. The prospect of injuries and sexual harassment has changed the way parents look at sports programs. A background check is required to volunteer for some positions with the CRC programs.

Meeting Hosted by Mary Lehman. The Prince George's County Council member for the Calverton area talked about planning. Need to build out from College Park to Laurel. Montgomery Road in Beltsville has been renovated with curbs and sidewalks installed. Sunnyside Avenue will be renovated and the bridge rebuilt. The county is looking at Old Gunpowder and Powder Mill Roads because there is more traffic on these roads, even though Ammendale Road was improved. Konterra development and the White Oak Science Gateway will bring many cars to our local roads.
