HIGHLIGHTS OF OCTOBER 2013 CCA BOARD MEETING

Minutes and Order of Business. The minutes were approved from the September Board meeting. The Board approved changing the Order of Business to accommodate the police officer.

Guest. Officer Justin Haynes, Prince George's Community Police, related an incident that occurred recently in the Calverton apartments. A call came in that a man was beating a woman. Police responded. While police were pursuing the suspect, the suspect tried to climb a fence. The suspect reached into a backpack. The police thought the suspect was going for a gun, and they shot the suspect. The incident is under investigation.

Officer Haynes said that police use radios, helicopters, and K-9 dogs to help stop suspects. The police do not

want to use force. He suggested that Calverton residents sign up for the Citizens Police Academy to learn and understand what police do and how they do it. He will send us information about the next start time for the Citizens Police Academy.

He said there were no patterns in breaking and entering: whether night or day, or front door or back door. Install lights and leave on all night. Let neighbors know when you will be gone. Stop newspaper and mail.

New police station in White Oak should make for a quicker response in Montgomery County. Call 911 if you see something. Do not confront anyone.

Treasurer's Report. Treasurer Tom H. gave the Treasurer's report. The 2014 membership dues are starting to come in. The insurance bond was paid. The recorder came in, which will assist the recording secretary in taking the minutes.

Crime Incidents. The following incidents were reported by Board Members.

- Armed robbery near the Calverton sign on Calverton Boulevard. A cell phone was stolen.
- Last spring, there was an aggravated robbery near the Calverton sign on Calverton Boulevard; the victim was beaten, and a jacket was stolen. A street light is needed there, as it is very dark.
- On Bexley Terrace, a house (rambler) was broken into by kicking down the door. The alarm system scared the would-be robbers. However, the alarm system was not on the upstairs doors but was set off when they exited downstairs. Nothing was reported taken.
- A house on Red Lion Lane had a similar break-in of house and shed. Power tools, snow blower, and generator were stolen. Robbers probably used a truck.

Happy Birthday, Mr. Turner! Albert Turner's 96th birthday is October 24. Mr. Turner developed Calverton and founded Carrollton Enterprises. The CCA Board signed a greeting card for him and will deliver it personally to him at his office.

Storage Space. The CCA vacated the storage space at Calverton Elementary School and moved the contents to temporary storage at the Calverton Pool. The CCA is working with the pool's proposal to negotiate long-term storage in a shed the CCA would build adjacent to the current pool shed.

New Programs. Nina H will look into setting up an Affordable Healthcare information forum. Other

programs to consider are on voter registration and CASA programs.

Laurel Mall. Nina H suggested contacting the office of Prince George's County Council Member Mary Lehman to get a contact for what is happening at the old Laurel Mall.

Calverton Sign. Jerry R sent a proposal of \$300 to the CCA for plants to be installed around the sign at Gracefield Road and Calverton Boulevard. The Board approved the proposal.

Meetings. The Montgomery County Council hearing on the White Oak Science Gateway may be October 29. The CCA needs to testify. Also, the Montgomery County Civic Federation is having a meeting on October 14 to discuss traffic related to the Science Gateway.

Washington Adventist Hospital. Ben M said that the certificate of need for the new hospital near Calverton was rejected because there were too many beds planned. The hospital administrators are scaling down the size of the hospital and will reapply.

Home Business. Ben M brought up the house on Calverton Boulevard with an enlarged driveway; they are running a transportation company. He asked if anyone had filed a complaint with Montgomery County.

Alfonso stated that there are so many businesses run out of Calverton homes.


