HIGHLIGHTS OF SEPTEMBER 2013 CCA BOARD MEETING

Three guests attended the meeting.

- John Lloyd, Prince Georges County Schools, High Point High School Accreditation Process and Survey, wanted Board members to fill out an online survey. Survey results would be used to plan for a 7-year plan for High Point High. The survey needed to be completed by September 13. The Accreditation Committee will visit High Point from March 31 to April 5, 2014.
- Officer Joy Patil, Montgomery County Police. Theft from vehicles is on the rise. Some arrests have been made. There have been some heroin overdoses. If you see anything drug-relatedneedles, syringes, or other paraphernalia, call the police.
- Officer Justin Haynes, Prince Georges Community Police. Now theft from vehicles involves theft of airbags. Many cars are not locked. Be sure to lock your car. Turn porch lights on at night. Make it

hard for thefts and make it so someone might hear something.

Treasurer's Report. CCA Treasurer Tom gave the Treasurer's Report. The 2013 July 4th celebration was \$800 under budget.

Bylaws. The revisions to the CCA Bylaws were approved by the Board. A few changes still need to be made. The Bylaws will be handed out at the Fall General meeting for CCA members to review. They will be voted on at the Spring General meeting.

Drug Free Signs. Frank C. Is working on getting the signs done and put up.

School Donations. The Board voted to donate \$200 each to Galway Elementary and Calverton Elementary Schools for support of their instructional programs.

Calverton Sign--Shanandale Drive. The Board voted to send a letter to Montgomery County to tear down the Calverton wall on Shanandale Drive. It is beyond repair and is a hazardous situation.

Calverton Sign--Calverton Boulevard. Jerry will design a plan and cost estimate for landscaping around the sign. Ornamental grasses seem to be the best bet since deer don't like them.

General Membership Meeting. The Program Committee for the upcoming Fall meeting agreed to send letters of invitation to speak to the elected officials and others of interest to the community. Nina, Rose, Carolyn, and Bernie volunteered to be on the committee.

National Night Out (NNO). Officer Joy Patil was thanked by the Board for her work to make the Calverton-Montgomery County NNO a success. Frank C. reported that the Beltsville, District VI NNO was a great success. Then Officer Haynes presented the CCA with an award for the CCA's donation to the District VI NNO.

Connect with the Community. William Steen, of Carrollton Enterprises, stated that this program has been a success at the different shopping centers. He thanked the CCA for its participation in the recent event at the Calverton Shopping Center. Carrollton Enterprises is planning another event next year. Steen announced that there was going to be a "Seasoned Citizen" Health Fair at the Largo Shopping Plaza Saturday, September 28 from 11 am to 3 pm.

Recorder for Recording Secretary. The Board voted to purchase a digital recorder with computer interface and to spend up to \$150 for it. This will make it easier for the Recording Secretary.

Shed on Oriole Drive. The issue of the shed that is too close to the street has not been resolved. The CCA needs to send a letter to Prince Georges County, then send a

letter to the press if the county does not help.

Code Violations. Several Board members brought up houses that may be in violation of county codes.

Happy Birthday. Albert Turner's 96th birthday is October 24. Mr. Turner developed Calverton and founded Carrollton Enterprises. The CCA Board will sign a greeting card for him and deliver it personally.

Storage Space Needed. The CCA must vacate the storage space at Calverton Elementary School. CCA Board members have talked to the Calverton Pool about temporary storage there. The pool has also been asked to consider long-term storage in a shed the CCA would build adjacent to the current pool shed.

July 4th Celebration. 2014 will mark the 50th anniversary of Calverton, and plans are to combine these two events (July 4th and the 50th anniversary) with a Calverton National Night Out. Details are forthcoming. A person is needed to lead the planning and implementation of this event (with the help of many other volunteers). Please volunteer

Calverton Directory. This is the year that the Directory will be updated, based on changes received from the 2014 membership dues collection. Frank C, Carol S, and Claire volunteered to serve on the Directory Committee; the Editor's position is still open. Please volunteer.

Laurel Shopping Center. Nina brought up that the CCA should find out what is planned at Laurel Shopping Center since it is being torn down. This could be a topic at a future Board meeting.

If you don't know who your Block Captain is, you can find out by looking at the block designation on your name line in the 2012 Calverton Directory (for example, B-39). The Block Captains, along with their phone numbers, are listed according to this scheme on pages 7 and 8 of the Directory.
