These problems will make Calverton ugly and unsafe, which makes the community less likely to attract home buyers. These problems will impact our property values by making the property value of our homes go down. So, we may lose money when we go to sell our house and may not be able to afford to buy another house. No one wants to live next to

a neighbor who is making their community unsafe and making their community look bad. No one wants to live in a community where neighbors are choosing a lifestyle of being selfish and choosing a lifestyle that is uncaring.

We all have to choose to care about our community. We all have to choose that we want our community to look nice and be safe for everyone who lives here and for everyone who visits here. Basic Facts: In Montgomery County and Prince George's County all camera-generated violations are reviewed by the police department's Automated Traffic Enforcement Unit and citations are mailed to the registered car owner. The camera-generated fine is \$125. No points are associated with a citation issued through this program. A citation for the same offense of passing a stopped school bus issued by a police officer is \$570 and three points on the license.

Tree stumps left and not removed after PEPCO cut down trees. Will contact PEPCO to look into stumps that were not removed in MC.

Neighborhood Watch sign at Calverton Boulevard and Gracefield Road will be replaced.
